The University of Scouting is an adult leader's learning adventure. It is an action-packed, fun-filled day of supplemental training where you choose the sessions you wish to take. Over 90 unique classes will be led by experienced volunteers who will help you enhance your ability to deliver a fun and exciting program to the youth in your unit(s). There are a variety of classes for new and veteran Scouters. For new Scouters, this training will be an important part of your Scouting journey. For experienced Scouters, this event will recharge your spirit and inspire you to a renewed enthusiasm for Scouting and all that it delivers to our youth. It's also a great opportunity to network with other Scout Leaders, make new friends, reconnect with old friends, and share best practices across the Council.

Who should attend?

University of Scouting is designed for all adult leaders regardless of function or program area. We also encourage interested parents to attend. The course selection is varied so that regardless of unit position, you will gain something to take back and implement in your unit. It doesn't matter if you are a first-year leader or a 50-year veteran, everyone is guaranteed to learn something new or gain a clearer understanding of the various aspects of the Scouting programs.

Anxiety, Mental Health, and Scouting **NEW!**

Learn the basics required to cook with a Dutch oven. Learn recipes, guidelines, best practices, resources, and ideas for your next cast-iron meal! We will:

- *Discuss and demonstrate controlling cooking temperatures
- *Discuss and demonstrate the proper cleaning and storing of Dutch ovens
- *Participants bake cookies, cook a personal pizza, and enjoy!
- *Answer questions as time permits

Dutch Oven Cooking: Advanced (2 hours)

- *Discuss and demonstrate cleaning and storing Dutch ovens
- *Discuss about preparation of food before a campout
- *Participant group will prepare and enjoy a Dutch oven soup.
- *Each participant will prepare either baked chicken or beef stew, bake cookies, and enjoy!

Each participant will receive a Dutch oven cookbook.

Flag Etiquette and Ceremonies

Learn about proper flag etiquette and the USA Flag Code, get ideas for jazzing up your unit's flag ceremonies -both indoor and outdoor, and where to find answers to all your questions about the proper way to handle, display, and store your United States flag.

Get into the Game—Geocaching and Letterboxing

This class introduces the outdoor sport of geocaching, a high-tech hide-and-seek treasure hunting game suitable for Scouters and Scouts of all ages. We also contrast and compare the very similar, but older and low-tech, game of letterboxing. Participants will:

- *Learn of the history of geocaching and letterboxing and how to get started.
- *Learn the equipment required, and safety considerations, for a geocaching or letterboxing activity.
- *See how to use these activities as part of Cub Scout and Scouts BSA activities, and applicability to advancement requirements.
- *Use a GPS to navigate to a hidden geocache or follow clues to a hidden letterbox (weather permitting).

Recommended but not required: come to class with a GPS unit or smartphone with a GPS app which will allow you to manually enter a waypoint (e.g., Gaia GPS, GPS Test, etc.).

Great Campfire Programs

Have you ever wanted to put together your own campfire program but don't know where to start? Remember having a hilarious time around the campfire but can't figure out how the skit worked or you forgot the punch-line? Want to be EXTRAVAGANT and silly or just spend time around a warm fire? Come learn ideas for having great campfires in your Unit campouts or District events and have fun in the progress. Learn how to:

- *Pick an appropriate length for your program. Most campfire programs are between 30 minutes and an hour and a half.
- *Decide who will contribute to the program.
- *Choose what kinds of content will go in your program.

Ham (amateur) radio is a great hobby for Scouts and Scouters. Learning how to operate a ham radio enables a Scout or Scouter to communicate within anyone around the globe. Additionally the skills it develops in communication and radio operation can extend into supporting your local community for events or emergency support. In this course you'll learn

- *Be able to demonstrate effective communication.
- *Be able to explain the steps to collaboration.
- *Be able to describe how Scouts and Scouters can improve communication and leadership skills through empathy.
- *Be able to explain why this is important in Scouting

Practical Empathy and Communication for Scouting II

Relational leadership, narrative leadership, and emotional intelligence are evident in highly effective, smoothly running, and cohesive teams. Learn how to put these elements to work in your unit and beyond. Participants will:

- *Understand listening and communication as skills and be able to demonstrate them.
- *Understand and be able to demonstrate how to work with conflict.
- *Be able to explain how "bad" behavior can be understood
- *Be able to explain power and leadership within Scouting.
- *Be able to describe how roles, urgency, team, and task determine leadership.

Self Harm, Suicide, and Scouting

This is a class designed to help you be better informed about the statistics, risks and warning signs of self-harm and suicidal ideation and how it impacts scouting and your role as a leader. It covers how to identify potential self-harm and suicidal behavior as well as how to respond and help a youth in crisis and provides helpful resources.

***Note:** The topics and information presented in this class deal frankly about self-harm and suicide which may be triggering to some people.*

CYL Offers These Tracks

Introductory Track

Best for newer scouts ages 11-13 or 14-15-year-olds with no leadership experience. This track puts an emphasis on basic leadership. Scouts will learn the required material to best lead a patrol. Skills learned include how to lead small groups, team building, goal setting, and other essential leadership knowledge.

Advanced Scout Track

Designed for 14-17-year-olds. This track is designed to empower scouts to become a Senior Patrol Leader. Advanced leadership skills are used in this course to improve upon previous experience and training. Scouts will find this track utilizes skills that they already have and teach them what they don't know so that they will be the best leader they can be.
